The award was presented on Friday April 25, 2014 during the SAMBA 29th annual meeting in Baltimore.

The Indian Association of Day Surgery

The 7th National Conference of The Indian Association of Day Surgery was recently held on the 19th - 20th of April, 2014, in the city of Chennai. This was the first time that the conference was held over 2 days. The first day was dedicated to televised live demonstrations of anaesthetic blocks, followed by surgery and then visiting the patients prior to discharge later in the day. Another first for our meeting was the separate parallel session for Nurses, who have now been inducted as Associate members of the Association. The meeting was graced by Dr. Ian Jackson, IAAS President, and other International speakers, with the participation of 230 delegates. The theme of the Conference was: Day Surgery: making it happen in India.

Health Affairs Journal Recognizes Cost Savings and Efficiencies Tied to ASCs

Research published in the May 2014 issue of *Health Affairs* journal finds that ambulatory surgery centers (ASCs) in the United States save money and increase efficiency for Medicare, insurers and patients, while providing the same high quality care as hospital outpatient departments. The authors of the study—health economists Elizabeth Munnich of the University of Louisville and Stephen Parente of the University of Minnesota—conclude that “ASCs are a high-quality, lower-cost substitute for hospitals as venues for outpatient surgery.” To read the full study, “Procedures Take Less Time At Ambulatory Surgery Centers, Keeping Costs Down And Ability To Meet Demand Up,” see the May 2014 issue of *Health Affairs*.
